## **2023 RULES OF GOLF: 5 KEY CHANGES**

The R&A and the USGA have released the most recent edition of the Rules of Golf, effective January 2023.

This change is consistent with other penalty reductions, such as reducing the penalty for playing an incorrectly substituted ball from the general penalty to one stroke.

### Key changes from Infographic and the CMMC

- 1. Modifications For Players With Disabilities
  - a. Rule 25 will be considered for any members that have a disability. USGA guidance will determine the accommodations for these players.
- 2. Replacing damaged clubs
  - a. This rule change gives the player an option to replace a club that is broken damaged during a round. The options to also use the club "as is" is still available as an additional option. Clubs broken in anger or abuse cannot be replaced under this rule.
- 3. Ball moved by natural forces
  - a. When you take relief and your ball is at rest, if natural forces moves the ball to another part of the course the ball must be replaced without penalty. For example, the ball must move from the GENERAL AREA into a PENALTY AREA.
- 4. Handicap on the scorecard
  - a. The player is no longer held responsible for an incorrect handicap on a stroke play scorecard. Putting the correct handicap on the card is the responsibility of the committee.
- 5. Simplified Back On The Line relief.
  - a. PENALTY AREAS and UNPLAYABLE BALL have an option of back on the line relief. The line is determined from the flag through the "entry point" (For PENALTY AREA) or "the ball" (for UNPLAYABLE). The reference point may be any place on this line no closer to the hole. The ball MUST be dropped on this line and MUST remain within 1 club length no closer to the hole.

#### Other Rules Issues

- 1. In individual stroke play competitions, all players must hole out at each hole. The player is not required to hole out in Stableford competitions, 0 points are given to the player if they do not hole out.
- 2.
